

Good Words for Great Souls

Out of sorts. That's a phrase I've come to appreciate over the past two years. I can remember my mother saying she felt "out of sorts" and wondering what it meant. I think I have a pretty good handle on it now. For me, it's an uneasy feeling that something is amiss or not quite right. You can't put your finger on it specifically, and you're not sure how to treat it, but you just sense something is not as it should be. I suppose this describes how I feel this Advent season. We as a worshiping community are trying our best to get things "back to normal," whatever that may mean these days, but we know in our hearts that mentally and emotionally we're not quite there yet. But maybe being "out of sorts" is precisely what we should be feeling this Advent season. Let me explain.

The scripture passage for the first Sunday in Advent is Luke 21:25-36. This passage has little to do with preparing for the Christ child. Instead, these verses describe what to look for and expect in the end times. They speak of signs in the heavens, the sun, moon, and stars, of distress among the nations, and the roaring of the sea and waves, people fainting from fear and foreboding about what is happening in the world. Jesus says that when these things happen, stand up and stay alert, because our redemption is drawing near! This is the part of Advent we don't talk about much—that our preparation and waiting is not just for the joy of celebrating the birth of Christ, but for anticipating the time when Christ will return.

I don't know when Christ will come again. Jesus tells us not to even try to figure it out, because no one knows the day and hour, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. But by being in community with one another, we can stay alert, encourage, and support each another, and take comfort knowing that we will be spiritually ready for whatever lies before us.
