As many of you already know, fall is my favorite time of year. Of course, as I write this, the temperature and humidity are still very high and the heat index is forecasted to go over 100°F today. It makes it a little difficult to think about cooler weather and crisp fall evenings, but I know it's coming! The rhythm of the seasons is one reason I love living here in Penns Valley.

Much like the seasons of spring, summer, fall, and winter, we also experience seasons in our church life. The expectancy of spring coincides with the season of Lent, a time when we are encouraged to examine our spiritual lives and seek reconciliation and forgiveness.

When Holy Week arrives, we are usually excited to see the beauty of the first spring flowers – the crocus and daffodils, and of course the abundant dandelions. The mystery of the resurrection is revealed in the new growth arriving on the trees and in our gardens. Soil that has lain dormant with no sign of life, suddenly springs into life and soon it's all we can do to keep up with the weeds! Even those weeds carry meaning as I remember Jesus' parable of the wheat and weeds.

Summer of course is a time of long days, children playing, s'mores around a campfire, and chasing after fire flies (or lightning bugs where I come from). It is a time of beach trips and amusement parks and, hopefully, a time when we can find rest and renewal, or at the least a break from our daily routines.

And then fall arrives, with roadside pumpkins and fields heavy with corn and beans, wheat and mounds of hay. The kids return to school, and a few sultry days of summer linger, teasing us a bit before the winter blast arrives. Another church season begins, and the classrooms once again resound with young voices and laughter.

These things remind me as well of the seasons of our lives. In the spring of life, we can't even imagine the winter, it's too far away to think about. It's a time of excitement, new love, and seemingly endless adventures. Then, in the summer of life, we're so busy rushing from here to there, doing all we can to live life to the fullest, raise our children, focus on our careers, and try to make sure we don't miss anything. And then the fall of life arrives, very suddenly, and we realize we can't do all the things we did before. The joints start creaking a bit, and we find ourselves needing to sit down more often and take a breather. But the fall of life is a beautiful time. It's a time when we can slow down a bit, spend some time in quiet contemplation, fond memories, and the joy of family gatherings.

I've recently been reading a work of fiction by Marilynne Robinson entitled *Gilead, A Novel.* It interested me because it is a series of letters written by an aging pastor to his young son. He covers a lot of ground in these letters, everything from stories of his childhood, to memories of his father and grandfather, to hopes he has for his young son as he grows up. The old pastor knows he won't be around to see it, the doctors have already told him those terrifying words, "There's nothing more we can do." There is one story the pastor tells that prompted me to stop and ponder the things I've felt were important in my life.

That mention of Feuerbach and joy reminded me of something I saw early one morning a few years ago, as I was walking up to the church. There was a young couple strolling along half a block ahead of me. The sun had come up brilliantly after

On some impulse, plain exuberance, I suppose, the fellow jumped up and caught hold of a branch, and a storm of luminous water came pouring down on the two of them, and they laughed and took off running, the girl sweeping water off her hair and her dress as if she were a little disgusted, but she wasn't. It was a beautiful thing to see, like something from a myth. I don't know why I thought of that now, except perhaps because it is easy to believe in such moments that water was made primarily for blessing, and only secondarily for growing vegetables or doing the wash. I wish I had paid more attention to it. My list of regrets may seem unusual, but who can know that they are, really. This is an interesting planet. It deserves all the attention you can give it."

Images of nature and life's simple things were the raw materials for the stories Jesus shared, of life and love, darkness and light, good and evil. And I think it is in these simple things, living out our existence each day, where life's important things take place. We must watch carefully so as not to miss them - a baby's laugh, rain against the window, the complexity of a single leaf, simple things, everyday things. It's worth thinking about this some more.
