

LENTEN BIBLE STUDY



Pastor Dave will be offering a Lenten study similar to the one offered during Advent. This study will be using the book, *Savior – What the Bible Says about the Cross*, by Magrey R. deVega. The classes will be held remotely on Thursday evenings beginning at 6:30 p.m. and concluding no later than 8:00 p.m. The first class will be on Thursday, February 25th.

Following is a brief summary of what participants can expect:

All of us deal with times of doubt in our lives where our faith is challenged. This book focuses on one of the central symbols of our faith: the work of Jesus on the cross. Specifically, we'll be addressing what Jesus's dying on the cross means. What exactly did Jesus do to save us from our sins? Why was the cross necessary, and what does it mean to us today? What is it about the way Jesus died that offers salvation for us? Why did Jesus do what he did, and what does that mean for us? And how can answers to these questions help us as our faith stretches and grows? Throughout history, the church has developed numerous answers to these questions under the broad theological term *atonement*. No single image or framework can possibly capture

a mystery as great as Jesus's death on the cross, so we'll be examining several of them.

This book will not only be useful for anyone who wishes to understand the meaning of Jesus's death, but also particularly helpful for anyone whose life situation is prompting a "crisis of faith" in relation to Jesus and the cross.

Please contact Pastor Dave or the church office if you have questions or to sign up for this study. Since the study will be hosted on the Zoom platform, participants can either participate via the internet, or by calling in on their home phones (audio only). Each participant will receive the book, *Savior – What the Bible Says about the Cross*.
