Just as it will take many people to raise Mark and help him become a faithful Christian and contributing citizen, so it is with us on our faith journey. We need people around us to encourage us and remind us of the important things in life. People like the members of our families, our friends, and our fellow brothers and sisters in Christ are all important contributors on this journey.

And for little Mark, he's got great parents, hopefully some good grandparents, future teachers and preachers and coaches that will be looking out for him, encouraging him, and helping him do the right things. LOVE DEFEATS FEAR

Over Christmas this past year, I picked up a book several people had recommended to me entitled, "Hillbilly Elegy" by J.D. Vance. It was a story about a young man that grew up in a poor and troubled home in an addiction-torn Appalachian family from rural Kentucky. Many of the stories from Vance's earlier childhood brought back some not-so-good memories of my own early years growing up in northern Vermont, although I never experienced the depth of misery he describes in his memoir. My parents were poor but determined and in time overcame many of the problems that plagued their humble and sometimes difficult beginnings.

But so many families, then and now, have not been able to break out of what I see as a multi-generational spiral into despair and poverty. We don't have to look very far here in rural Pennsylvania to see evidence of this around us. Drug and alcohol addictions, broken families, domestic violence and abuse, and even children going hungry, are all indicators that there is something profoundly wrong in our communities. We are fortunate here in Penns Valley to have good schools and teachers, and access to good medical care when we need it, but not every place is like this. And while some have prospered in recent years, too many others have seen their professions and industries change or go away entirely, and watched as their standard of living declined. These difficulties have contributed to what I believe is an erosion of family values and structures.

Over the last year, I have watched as our nation continues down a path of anger and discord over what the right steps should be regarding our future. And I've wondered, what should I be doing as a Christian, and as a spiritual leader, as I see these things happening? I've tried to encourage you through my messages on Sunday to look for the good in others, to be kind and compassionate, less critical and more encouraging, and to show God's love through our words and actions. But is there something else we as the body of Christ should be doing?

Some scriptures I read recently from 1 John 4 (NRSV) are as follows:

"18There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear; for fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not reached perfection in love. ¹⁹We love because he first loved us. ²⁰Those who say, "I love God," and hate their brothers or sisters, are liars; for those who do not love a brother or sister whom they have seen, cannot love God whom they have not seen. ²¹The commandment we have from him is this: those who love God must love their brothers and sisters also."

As I reflected on these words, it seemed to make sense that much of our disunity as a people is driven by fear. Fear can be a horrible thing that prompts us to do things we later regret. And then I realized that this scripture also describes a response to fear – love. Love can defeat fear if we are diligent and persistent in our pursuit to become Christ-like. And it comes down to how we treat people. When we succumb to anger, and turn that anger on others, we are allowing fear to have control in our lives. And when we, professed Christians and servants of God fall into this trap, what hope is there? We must be the peacemakers.

Just recently we read the Beatitudes in church, Matthew 5:1-11. And it was verse 9 that said, "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God." We are God's children, co-heirs of the Lord Jesus Christ, and we are called to be peacemakers. So let it begin today, with each of us, and let's see what we can do to turn this tide of evil that is destroying our families and our communities. This world needs us, and God is counting on us.
