Dear Church Family,

I was walking through a store recently when I noticed a sign that said, 'Humble Yourself, Or Life Will Do it for You." I paused and reflected on that sign for a moment and thought about the truth in it. Humility is not something we think about very often, but maybe we should. We know from the verses in Galatians 5:22-23, that while humility is not listed as one of the fruits of the Spirit, it is certainly implied and spoken of elsewhere in God's word. Yet being humble is not something highly prized by our society. These thoughts led me to think about Jesus' life, and how he humbled himself, time after time, in the face of injustice and threats, and even in death.

Aside from Galatians, there are many scriptures in both the Old and New Testaments that speak to humility. Proverbs 18:11-12 says: "The wealth of the rich is their strong

city; in their imagination it is like a high wall. Before destruction one's heart is haughty, but humility goes before honor." In the New Testament, Ephesians 4:1-3 records the words of the Apostle Paul: "I therefore, the prisoner in the Lord, beg you to lead a life worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, making every effort to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace." And one of my favorites is Philippians 4:3-4, "Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others." One of the ways we show humility before God is to kneel in prayer. It is a humble act. When we kneel before someone or something we are offering our reverence and respect.

Somehow, over the past few months, that has all been turned around. It seems kneeling is now a sign of disobedience and disrespect, especially when done by football players during the playing of the national anthem. The players themselves say it is a sign of unity, and a way to demonstrate their solidarity in the face of continued injustice in our country. Others have interpreted this kneeling as a slight against our nation's flag and all it stands for, most notably the men and women that have served and given their lives to protect our country and our freedoms. Like everyone else, I have my opinion and have shared it with others – some of my friends agree, others do not. And I am fine with that. The relationships I've formed over the years can withstand a disagreement now and then, and if we're mature about it, we learn to listen carefully to one another, and try to understand and learn from a different perspective. But that doesn't seem to be the norm anymore. Instead, what we see is anger and overt hatred over any views that deviate from our own. Friendships disintegrate in a flurry of name-calling and derision. And I'm trying to understand why this has happened, and what I should say or do to make it stop.

And this brings me back to humility. The nine fruits Paul used to admonish the church at Galatia were: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. I memorized these fruits years ago and have taken the time to self-evaluate each day and reflect on whether my words and actions have reflected these fruits. I've decided to add "humility" to this list. Like I said previously, I think the "fruits" Paul lists imply humility, but the words Paul also wrote in Philippians have convinced me that I need to focus more on this quality in my life. Like you, I struggle sometimes with how to respond to the events of this world, more so now than at any other time in my life. I want to be the kind of person that upholds Christ's commandment to love one another, just as Christ has loved us (John 13:34). I want to avoid being drawn into disrespectful and mean-spirited rhetoric, regardless of the topic. And I want others to see within me a word of hope. And I don't want to see the practice of kneeling in humility and respect lost in all the noise. So, I will continue to kneel to the majesty of God (at least I will once my knee is fixed!), and I hope you will too.
